

# The Noack Practice Organ

The Noack Practice organ is a four-rank two-manual and pedal instrument with mechanical action. It is housed in a solid white oak case traditionally crafted with hand-carved pipeshades.

## Specification:

### Manual I

Gedackt 8 61 pipes

Principal 4 61 pipes

### Manual II

Recorder 8 37 pipes, partially  
common with Gedackt

### Pedal

Stopt Bass 8 30 or 32 pipes

Principal 4 common with Man I



## Comments:

The Gedackt is a 20% tin stop with domed soldered covers. The Principal 4 is made of 70% tin with 13 pipes (E-c ) in facade. It appears also on the Pedal. The Recorder is a fairly narrow gently tapered stopped metal rank (20% tin) which shares its two lower octaves with the Gedackt . This stop has proven to be extremely useful being more "defined" and transparent than the Gedackt of the lower manual. The 8' Stopt Bass is made of wood.

## Technical details

Keyboard C-c<sup>'''</sup> - 61 notes

Ebony- covered naturals, bone-capped sharp

Pedal C-f' 30 notes flat pedalboard or C-g' 32 notes AGO pedalboard  
in white oak.

Self adjusting mechanical action.

Pine backfalls

Maple action squares

Brass pulldown wires

115 Volt AC blower in sound absorbing enclosure inside the organ.

Wedge-shaped bellows, wooden wind trunk.

Bench with blocks for height adjustment.
